

Welcome to Boerne

Small Town. Big Art.

Boerne (pronounced Burn-Knee) is a small German-heritage town located just 30 minutes outside San Antonio. Despite its close proximity to the 8th largest city in the United States, Boerne has retained a wonderful feeling of Old World Charm. Boerne was named as one of the "Top 5 Places to Retire in the United States" by Where to Retire Magazine, and the town is not only a great place to retire, but a great place to vacation.


The Boerne Visitor's Center is located at 1407 S. Main. The walls of the center are accented with vibrant pieces from local artists. Once you leave the Visitors Center, continue your way a little further down Main Street (Hauptstrasse) and you will find a treasure trove of stores just waiting for you. The tastefully restored Main Street offers many antique stores, gift shops, art galleries, restaurants, coffee shops and bakeries, and European architecture. In fact, many of the buildings located in the Historic Downtown District look as they did a century ago.

The newest restaurant in town, the Tin Roof Steakhouse, a simply gorgeous new place that stays open late and night and often has entertainment in the piano lounge. A classic upscale steak house, this is quickly becoming a favorite of locals and tourists alike. Located next to the Cibolo Creek bridge, check this place out while you are in town.

You can paint the town red on the second Saturday of each month at a growing list of arts venues for "Second Saturday Art & Wine" night (5pm- 8pm). Enjoy art, wine, dining, and great conversation as you stroll around town and visit the various

galleries and studios. Fotoseptiembre also takes place at various galleries throughout the month of September. Thunderbox Road premieres in Boerne on October 4th. It's a traveling exhibit of 12 outhouses (Thunderboxes) on display along the Cibolo River showcasing the artistic talents of 12 of the top artists in the Hill Country.

There are a host of other activities taking place this fall including the Kendall County Fair (Aug. 29-31); Key to the Hills Rod Run (Oct. 10-12); Fall Festival of Art and Music (Oct. 17-19); Key to the Hills Antique Show (Oct. 25-26); Harvest Moon Celebration (Oct. 25); and Boerne's B&B and Cuisine Tour (Nov. 2).

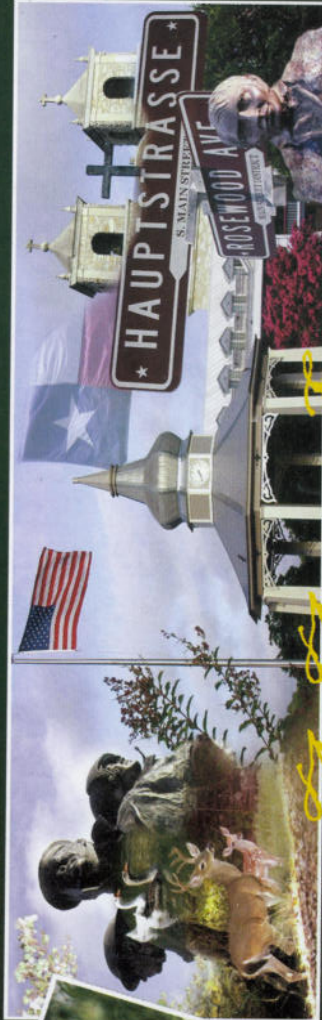
