Art Exhibit Continues Hill Country Tour

Thunderbox Road is a traveling exhibit of 12 outhouses (Thunderboxes) showcasing the artistic talents of 12 of the top artists in the Hill Country. The tour continues until May 9, 2009, when the works will be auctioned at the Museum of Western Art in Kerrville to benefit medical and educational foundations.

Sand Creek Post & Beam of Texas, a master dealer for Sand Creek Post & Beam barn kits, located in Bergheim, built the Thunderboxes and distributed them to artists in July of 2008. The works of art were completed in September and began their tour in Boerne in October.

The 12-piece exhibit continues its

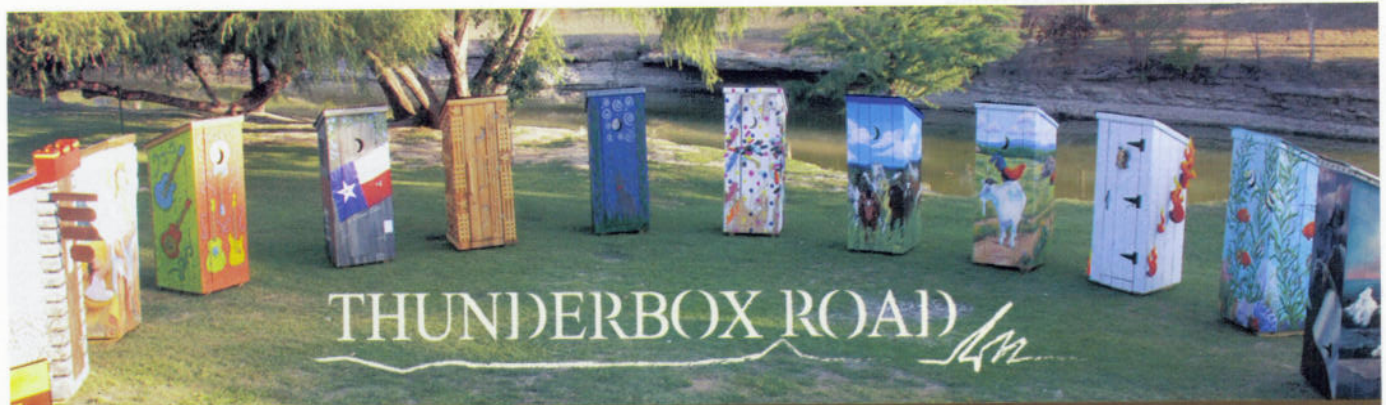
Hill Country and San Antonio tour in November at Grape Creek Vineyards in Fredericksburg, in December at the Sand Creek Post & Beam of Texas headquarters and in January at the Historic Menger Hotel across from the Alamo in San Antonio.

The project's goal is to highlight artists and arts organizations

throughout the Hill Country. Representatives from Hill Country Arts organizations will serve on the Judge's Panel, determining the \$ 5,000 cash award for the Judge's Choice Award. To determine the winner of the People's Choice Award, also a \$ 5,000 cash award, there will be ballots at each hosting venue as well as voting online at www.ThunderboxRoad.com.
